The Cone Exchange is a Bettys & Taylors of Harrogate community project and they exchange, re-use and sell the waste materials they receive. All proceeds from the shop sales are donated to local social enterprises, including Horticap and Jenny Ruth Workshops as well as Bettys & Taylors Trees for Life project - supporting tree planting and tree preservation in Yorkshire and in tea and coffee growing countries celebrating their passion for the planet.

CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING

Four years ago the Rotary Club of Harrogate, as part of its environment activities, implemented a project to recycle Christmas trees and raise much needed funds to support local charities at the same time.

They target two housing areas in Harrogate, and between Christmas and the New Year they carry out a leaflet drop to the houses in both catchment areas.

The Rotary Club invite householders to let them pick up their discarded Christmas trees on a specified date for a minimum donation of £3.

On the first Saturday of the New Year, two teams of Rotary volunteers then walk around the selected areas collecting the trees. With the help of the Horticap truck and trailer they are then transported back to our nursery for recycling.

To date the Rotary Club have raised \pounds 3,110 through this initiative, of which \pounds 1,260 has been donated to Horticap. Thanks go to them for all for their hard work, it's wonderful that we can work together on this project and we hope we can continue for many more Christmases to come.





BEDS and BORDERS

This year we have big plans for the Horticap garden area, and Tom is looking forward to working with the students, volunteers and colleagues to enhance the garden pathways and borders and to make them an even more attractive and dynamic space for our customers and friends.

Some of our perennials have spread quickly so these will be divided and the maturing trees and shrubs are casting more shade so there will be plenty to keep the team busy. They have recently trimmed a large conifer hedge and started pruning works and are excited by the prospect of revitalising the area with some fresh planting making it a wonderful experience as you walk through and continuing to give year round interest.

We are looking forward to seeing the new changes and will be potting up and dividing the plants that have been lifted. Some of these may go back into the garden area and some may go for resale. Either way, we don't waste anything at Horticap.

We built one INSECT HOUSE

and now we have two... the first is situated in our Nature Trail. It was such a success that we built another one in our show garden at Harrogate Autumn Flower Show. We won a Gold Award and Best In Show and this one also came back to live at Horticap.

The insect house was so popular that we were asked to build one for Hookstone Chase Primary School in Starbeck. Andy and his team of students set off to deliver and set up the house. They also created a 'music machine' using lots of items from the scrapheap for percussion, and built two pallet planters ready for the children to fill with compost and plantup. Our students have enjoyed making and painting —

these items and the children came out to thank them. Their order is by no means complete and we still have to construct a Wendy house, a stage and a painting easel – all good projects for rainy days in the workshop!

A large Hartley cottage greenhouse was kindly donated to Horticap, and in October 2016 volunteers Craig and William, along with student Paul O'Brien, set about erecting the new structure.

There were over a thousand pieces and no instructions, so the power of Google came to the fore and William researched how to put it together.

Over several Tuesdays the greenhouse came to life, although there were a few problems along the way! Glass not fitting, not enough seals and spare parts left over, however the completed greenhouse now sits within the vegetable plot and Craig is looking forward to filling it this year with cucumbers, peppers and tomatoes.

"It's a tremendous addition to the veg plot and I'm very excited about what we will able to grow. Thanks go to Paul who was waiting every Tuesday for us to arrive. We were very proud of what he achieved, turning his hand to almost everything during the construction. Top Dog! The students made new friends when we had a visit from

Penny and Edie, her highly trained working guide dog. Edie is a German Shepard cross and has been with Penny for two years. She explained to the students how important it is that owners are matched with their potential guide dog, taking into account a person's needs - walking speed, height and lifestyle and that one of the Guide Dog Mobility Instructors spends up to five weeks training the guide dog owner and the dog together. The guide dogs need to be calm and confident in all situations and Edie was certainly a perfect example. Once Penny had removed Edie's harness, the students were able to give Edie lots of pats and ask Penny questions. Does Edie like treats? Yes, most definitely, but Penny has to ensure that Edie doesn't get fat or get a poorly tummy! Does she bark? Yes, but not very often! How many Guide dogs are there? There are over 4,950 guide dog owners in the UK. We also learnt that as well as providing help through their dogs, the charity campaigns for the rights of those with visual impairments and it invests in eve disease research.

We had a fantastic informative afternoon so a big thank you to Penny and Edie. The Guide Dogs do remarkable work and the dogs certainly do change people's lives.


