Our Friends...The Blue Water Partnership

The Blue Water Partnership are a Harrogate based business who specialise in helping managers develop leadership, management and influencing skills. Established in 2000 they operate across the UK and work with organisations large and small. Part of their remit has always been voluntary support through their internal 'Making A Difference' initiative.

In 2005 they funded the building of a nursery school in the Gambia, West Africa through the Gambian Schools Trust, and they continue to support the school by the annual payment of staff wages.

In 2009 Blue Water sought to adopt a UK project and made contact with Horticap who are local to the Blue Water office in Harrogate.

Blue Water has supported Horticap by funding various initiatives and advising on issues around marketing and promotion. SWARM PROJECT

A selection of students took part in the 'Swarm Project' run by Professional Artist Laney Birkhead. The aim of this unique eco project is to educate and to raise awareness of the plight of our British honeybee population through the art of printing. By involving groups of people, Laney's aim is to print 40,000 bees; the same number of bees within one beehive, and to produce one enormous Swarm of Bees artwork.

Each student made their own bee printing block and printed their bees onto a piece of calico that will become part of the finished work.

The students really enjoyed it and were extremely proud of their achievements. They were delighted to become part of the project which will culminate as part of an exhibition to be held at the Inspired Gallery in Whitby 22nd July to 9th August 2016. More details about this project can be found at
