He removes the nails from the donated pallets, and he bags up the wood ready for our customers to buy. Ross has been at Horticap since 2003 and is also very keen on landscaping, so he's often out and about in the van with the gardening team. "I love the fresh air and learning new skills and I have made so many friends here" Ross explains. He spends Monday evening at "Happy Mondays" a weekly social group. Then it's another active day on Tuesday when he goes to Open Country, a Harrogate-based charity which enables anyone with a learning disability to access the countryside and where Ross gets involved in activities like walking, litter picking, and clearing pathways.

Wednesday is soon here and it's time to start work at RHS Harlow Carr in Harrogate, sorting out the deliveries, stocking up the shelves and tidying up the sales areas. "It's a very busy day and it's great to help the customers find what they are looking for, I love it". There's no rest on Thursday, when Ross heads to Paperworks, a social enterprise in Harrogate supporting work skills and where Ross can get involved in document shredding, envelope filling and computer work. "I like the different type of work we do at Paperworks, and the day goes so fast". It may be the end of the week but it's back to Open Country on Friday and the weekend is spent shopping and having lunch with his mum.

Ross says 2019 is his *"happy year"* and we reckon it will not only be a happy year, but a very busy one!

We are delighted to confirm that planning permission has been granted and we are going ahead with our new shop and tea room development. We had hoped to start this year, but we now anticipate that the build will start early in 2020.
