It's Feeding Time...

We've been so busy over the last few months with the new building, but at last the shop is open. As well as our gifts and cards, we are also thinking about all the delicious cakes and teas we hope to be serving our customers and we can't wait to welcome everyone back in the spring. But it's not just our customers we want to feed. It's also time to start thinking about the wildlife in our gardens, especially the birds. Winter can be a tough time for them and it's always fascinating to watch them on the search for food, but once they have finished eating the seeds, berries and insects, the birds will be on the lookout for food to keep them aoina over winter.

Help them out, grab a few pine cones and enjoy this wonderful and easy activity which is a favourite with our students.

Ingredients

- Pine cones (dried out)
- · Bird seed, sunflowers
- Suet or lard
- A mixing bowl
- String, wire
- (eyelets help with hanging)



Make your bird mix

- 1. Allow the lard to warm up to room temperature, cut it up into small pieces and put it into a mixing bowl.
- 2. Add the other ingredients to the bowl and mix them all together until the fat holds everything together.
- 3. Add an eyelet to the cone and loop the string around the top or just use string or wire. As long as you can hang the cone up afterwards!
- 4. Pack the sticky bird mix around the cones with your hands, creating a ball shape.
- 5. Put your cones in the fridge to set for an hour or so. After that they'll be ready to hang up.
- 6. Then it's time to sit back and wait for the birds to arrive which shouldn't be too long.

Message from Our Chairman...



students, staff, volunteers, customers, and the trustees of Horticap (as it has been for the rest of the world)! Our year began with the demolition of our shop and tearoom, followed by the start of our new building, the planning and consultation of which took some time to ensure it would further enhance the warm, friendly atmosphere of our organisation. Then along came the pandemic, and although building work stopped for over two months, we now have a fantastic structure to look forward to using, and shortly we will have a beautiful garden, which we are to name "Peter's Garden", in memory of our student, who sadly passed away and left us a legacy that helped to make all this possible.



Our students left us in March, and they've not yet been able to return. Hopefully, that will happen soon, so we can resume "normal activities". It's certainly been strange without the students, but we haven't stood still. In early spring, we decided to provide a delivery service for our plants, which had been growing in our glass houses. We received over 700 orders which, through the enormous effort of our staff and volunteers, we managed to fulfil. Thank you to everybody involved in this monumental achievement. This meant that none of our plants were wasted, and we managed to maintain a steady income stream



during those difficult months. We also closed our doors to customers in March, but re-opened in July, recognising the need for social distancing and other government guidelines regarding Covid-19.

We're now planning a delivery service for the Christmas trees. We understand that people like picking their own special tree, but because we usually sell in excess of 1,000 trees in early December, it won't be possible to accommodate the vast number of people to come to us. We hope our loyal customers will understand the situation and continue to support us.

Looking forward, we are currently reviewing our fiveyear Strategic Plan, as we're excited about what we can do with our new facilities. The two-storey building, with a veranda at the rear, will enable us to do things a bit differently. There will be a proper kitchen to enable us to turn our modest tearoom into a full café early in 2021, plus we'll have a fully stocked shop and meeting room/venue facilities.

Why are we doing all this? We want to continue to enhance the supportive and friendly environment we have at Horticap and to continue to transform care for our students. And we want to extend their knowledge and skills through structured training in horticulture and life skills, using professionally qualified staff and volunteers.

Have a super Christmas everyone. It may be different this year, but let's hope we can still enjoy the festivities in a safe manner and may 2021 bring us back to some sort of normality.
