Our nursery is still open for customers...



It's been a challenging year for all our students but we'd like to introduce you to the three Hannahs who would love to share their lockdown tales with you...

So here's Hannah E and despite all the restrictions she's been very busy. Back in the early months of the pandemic, she was busy sowing seeds and planting out, and helping her Mum, Dad and sister in the garden getting ready for summer. She planted vegetables and flowers and of course the Horticap sunflowers. Hannah spent lots of time outside in the garden, but when the weather wasn't too good, she was inside baking.

So that's our plans for inside, but what about outside? Well, to start with we are revamping our nature trail with the help of a £5,000 grant from property and energy firm The Banks Group's Banks Community Fund. We have wanted to improve the trail for some time but we are now able to do this thanks to the Banks Group.

And another thank you goes to local landscaping contractor Nick Fryer, a long-term supporter of Horticap, who has been appointed to carry out the required work, with some of our students assisting him - as and when it's safe for them to be on site.

We are aiming to finish work as soon as possible, with a view to being able to welcome visitors back later in the year as the pandemic restrictions begin to ease. And we are also hoping to use the new facilities as a way of extending the role it plays in the wider community. We would love to see the public and community groups making use of what we have to offer, once the warmer weather arrives and we're able to fully open our doors again. So far we have built a natural woodland shelter and a woodland seating area with a fire pit.

As Lewis Stokes, community relations manager at The Banks Group, explains "Horticap has a positive community impact that extends far beyond simply providing somewhere nice to spend some time in the open air, and it's great for us to be part of a project that will be shared with so many local people in the years to come. We look forward to everyone visiting the trail soon".


world as we sat and had a cup of tea outside.


