Fiona, the Instructor who is leading this project says "the intention is to grow fruit and vegetables organically in an environment that benefits from the wide range of pollinators, including our busy bees, that live close by. Alongside the fruit and veg, our students will be including companion planting with plants that attract all of the very important pollinators. This will ensure that they are all well catered for too!"

We have fruit trees already for sale in the sales greenhouse and the veg plants will be available to buy as soon as they're ready.
